





To prevent the Daleks' conquest of Earth, the Doctor must break a time paradox.

Season 9 Episode 4 First Broadcast: 22 January 1972

he Doctor is strapped to a table and subjected to the Daleks' mind analysis machine. He lies helpless as images of his two former selves are projected onto a screen. "You are the Doctor!" the Gold Dalek cries. "You are an enemy of the Daleks! Now you are in our power, you will be exterminated!" The other Daleks join in the chant: "Exterminated! Exterminated! Exterminated!" The Controller interrupts the Daleks. He asks them to spare the Doctor's life, saying that he could have valuable information on the human resistance. The Gold Dalek wishes to continue using the mind analysis machine, but the Controller points out that a simple admission of the Doctor's identity has almost killed him: "He'll die before he tells you anything else!" The Controller offers to interrogate the Doctor instead. The Doctor is brought to his feet. He can barely speak after the ordeal of the mind analysis. The Gold Dalek proudly tells him that the Daleks now have the secret of time travel and have invaded Earth again. "We have changed the pattern of history!"





At the guerrillas' headquarters, Monia, Anat and Boaz make their plans to rescue the Doctor. They head off down a disused underground railway...

The Doctor, Jo and the Controller are soon together once more. The Doctor tells the Controller that he knows nothing of the guerrillas' plans. He angrily accuses the Controller of being a traitor. The Controller defends himself, saying, "Nobody who did not live through those terrible years can understand." He



describes how a series of wars broke out at the end of the 20th century that lasted a hundred years. The survivors were left to starve. There was nothing to stop the Daleks from taking over. "So, they've turned the Earth into a giant factory, with all the wealth and minerals looted and taken to Skaro," the Doctor says. The Controller proudly says that his family has been aiding the Daleks for three generations. He tells the Doctor that he has helped save lives by winning concessions from the Daleks. The Doctor says that he would have helped more by organising resistance against his masters. The Controller dismisses talk of rebelling against the Daleks, insisting that they cannot be beaten.

Outside, an Ogron guard is knocked unconscious by a guerrilla. Their attack on the security complex begins. Boaz saves Anat from being killed by attaching an explosive to a Dalek. He destroys it but also dies in the blast. Laser beams criss-cross the complex as guerrillas and Ogrons blast away at each other. The guerrillas succeed in wiping out the opposition and storm the complex. They rescue the Doctor and Jo. Monia intends to kill the Controller but the Doctor asks him to show the man mercy. The Controller is left alone with his thoughts...

In the 20th century, the Brigadier and Mike Yates continue to search for the Doctor. The Brigadier receives word that Sir Reginald Styles and the party of international delegates will be arriving very soon.

The guerrillas take the Doctor and Jo to



their headquarters. They tell them that, according to their history books, Styles betrayed the delegates by blowing up a house, killing them all. This triggered the century of world wars. The guerrillas explain that they intended to travel back in time and kill Styles before he causes the explosion, thus saving Earth. Monia now wants the Doctor to go back and kill Styles for them.

The guerrilla who originally travelled back to the 20th century, Shura, staggers through the woods and manages to sneak into the basement of Auderly House. He has a Dalekanium bomb with him.



Director Paul Bernard was tasked with creating the first colour *Doctor Who* story to feature the Daleks. However, he found the existing Dalek props in a poor state. "I was a bit dismayed, I must admit," he commented. "When we went downstairs to the storeroom where these things were kept, I don't think anyone knew how many were there. We

found three – rather battered – and the remnants of a fourth which was put in for refurbishment. Then a costing was done and everyone was astonished at how much it was going to cost to make a Dalek. Well, with all the other costs that were already being judged, Barry [Letts, producer] decided he had no money for that sort of thing and so it was down to my ingenuity to do the best I could." New eyestalks and eyeballs (with pupils) were added to the props, and their dome lights were replaced with car sidelights.



There was initially some dialogue in the first scene between the Doctor and the Daleks that referred to the events of the previous story to feature them: The Evil of the Daleks. The Doctor said, "I've defeated you before. I introduced the human factor into the Daleks on Skaro. There was a rebellion..." The Gold Dalek interrupted him, stating, "The rebellion was unsuccessful. The rogue Daleks were hunted down and exterminated." This part of the scene was taped but ultimately cut. The scene begins instead with the Gold Dalek's line, "The Daleks have discovered the secret of time travel."

In the future, the Doctor learns about the Dalekanium bomb and realises the truth. "You're trapped in a temporal paradox!" he tells Anat and Monia. "Styles didn't cause that explosion and start the wars - you did it yourselves!"

The Gold Dalek accuses the Controller of failure. He says that he is setting up an ambush for the Doctor in the tunnels. He leaves to supervise the operation.

The Doctor and Jo enter the tunnels and are quickly caught by the Ogrons. The Controller steps out of the shadows. The Doctor convinces him that there is a chance to defeat the Daleks and spare



Earth from the wars. The Controller lets them leave, but he is being watched by the Senior Guard.

The Doctor and Jo return to the 20th century and are found by Sgt Benton.

The Daleks discover that the Controller has betrayed them and announce his extermination. Before he dies, the Controller stands defiantly and says, "Who knows? I may have helped to exterminate vou." The Daleks realise their danger - they know they must pursue the Doctor back to the 20th century to stop him from saving Styles.

The Doctor and Jo return to Auderly House just after Styles and the delegates arrive. They tell the Brigadier and Styles to evacuate the building. The Daleks and Ogrons appear in the tunnel beneath the bridge and attack the UNIT soldiers. The Doctor finds Shura in the cellar. Shura warns him to stay back, aiming his gun and brandishing the detonator for the Dalekanium bomb. The Doctor tries to convince him of the time paradox.

The UNIT forces are no match for the Daleks and Ogrons, but they hold them off long enough for Styles and the delegates to escape. Jo joins the Doctor in the cellar. Shura realises that the Doctor has been telling the truth. There is no way to rig a timer on the bomb. Shura tells them to go.

The UNIT forces fall back and let the Daleks and Ogrons enter Auderly House, which has been abandoned by everyone except Shura. The guerrilla smiles



and hits the detonation button. The house is completely destroyed, killing the Ogrons and Daleks.

The Doctor, Jo and Styles watch the destruction. The Doctor tells Styles that he has a second chance to make sure his conference is a success. "Don't worry," Styles says. "We all know what will happen if we fail."

The Doctor smiles at Jo. "So do we. We've seen it happen, haven't we, Jo?"







Actor Scott Fredericks played Boaz. "I had a few scenes with Jon Pertwee: We got on fine but there were a few 'tricks' he used to play that I wasn't too happy about. One of them was to tell gags just before a take to make you laugh. There was also this joke fight I did with him which he choreographed. He'd convinced the director that he knew all about fighting because he'd been some sort of a commando, but it ended up looking quite comical. My kids, though, loved it. All the things I've ever done, and that's their favourite!" Boaz's final scene was memorable for a different reason: "My character gets killed blowing up a Dalek. It was a location shoot, and as I lay there on the ground, daubed in ketchup, I suddenly realised that everyone else had cleared off. I just managed to stop the wardrobe van in time to get a lift!"



HIERARCHY

he Daleks have always been creatures guided by a strict order. They have little sense of individuality and rarely question commands given by a superior. While all Daleks originate from the same genetic template, not all are created equal. Some Daleks are intentionally bred with a greater capacity for imagination, cunning and intelligence than their comrades. There are many different ranks for these 'officer class' Daleks.

DALEKS

THE EMPEROR DALEK ▼


At the top of the Dalek hierarchy stands the Emperor. There have been several Emperors in Dalek history. The first was spawned before the Daleks departed Skaro for the first time. It was the same size as a normal Dalek but its dome was much larger and its armour was painted gold.



A later Emperor patterned itself on the original with a similar design. It encountered a time-travelling Dalek known as the Dalek Prime Strategist. They faced a devastating enemy from another universe known simply as the Entity. The Emperor outwitted the Mechanoids and the Entity, turning them against each other.

One Emperor was a large, immobile creature that was physically plugged into the internal systems of the Dalek city on Skaro. It was destroyed when the Second Doctor triggered a civil war by creating a race of humanised Daleks.

The Emperor that commanded the Daleks during the Time War was a



massive construct with a visible Dalek mutant beneath its dome. After escaping the Time War, it fell prey to delusions of godhood. It was destroyed by Rose Tyler who had absorbed the power of the Time Vortex and been briefly transformed into the Bad Wolf.

Davros also claimed the title 'Emperor' for a brief time when his neo-Daleks took control of Skaro. He completely sealed himself inside a Dalek shell with a large white dome. His reign ended when the Seventh Doctor tricked him into destroying Skaro with the Hand of Omega.

THE PARLIAMENT OF THE DALEKS

In times of extreme crisis, thousands of Daleks are sometimes summoned together to confer with one another. The collective term for an assembly of high-ranking Daleks is 'Parliament'. One such occasion was the threat of the Dalek Asylum inmates being released. The Eleventh Doctor, Amy Pond and Rory Williams were captured and brought before the Parliament, but were surprised to find that the Daleks were seeking their assistance.

PRIME MINISTER OF THE DALEKS

The head of the Parliament is referred

to as the Prime Minister. It is a Dalek mutant with no armour which is left exposed inside a transparent tank. Its intellect is extremely high. It absorbs the mental input of the Parliament and offers quidance to the Dalek Supreme.

THE DALEK SUPREME >

There have been many Dalek Supremes. Their rank is second only to the Emperor, and there have even been periods when a Supreme has taken complete control of Dalek society in the absence of an Emperor. Supremes are dispatched across the universe to take command of specific operations. They are differentiated by colour – their armour is usually predominately black, although gold is also sometimes used. The Dalek Supreme in charge of the Reality Bomb operation was red with an armature placed around its midriff.

THE NEW DALEK PARADIGM

A new race of Daleks was created in the early 1940s. A device known as the Progenitor was found by Daleks who discovered that it housed DNA from the earliest Dalek mutants. This was judged to be the most 'pure' Dalek material in the universe, and was used to create the New Paradigm. They were five Daleks with individual colour schemes. They were much larger than the original Daleks, and most aspects of the casing design had been modified in some way. One difference was what seemed to be an organic eve inside the evepiece. The Paradigm's backs were bulkier and contained specialised equipment. The New Paradigm judged themselves to be the only 'true' Daleks in existence.

THE CULT OF SKARO ▼

Four Daleks were created by the Emperor during the Time War with Gallifrey. They broke tradition by giving themselves





names: Sec, Jast, Thay, and Caan. They were bred to have the highest capacity for imagination and creative thought of any Daleks in history. Their function was to anticipate and counter the Time Lords' more skilful weaponisation of time travel. The Cult of Skaro considered themselves above even the commands of the Emperor. Before the end of the Time War, the Cult escaped into the void that exists between dimensions. They took with them the Genesis Ark, a piece of Time Lord technology used to imprison thousands of Daleks.

DALEK DRONES

Drones are typical Dalek soldiers. They make up by far the greatest numbers in Dalek society. Drones are mass-produced in their billions inside Dalek genetics factories. They have almost no imagination and are dependent on receiving orders from higher-ranking Daleks. They have no sense of self-preservation and will gladly sacrifice themselves for the purposes of the Dalek cause. If they are left for long periods in an isolated environment with no commands, Drones usually power down their systems and go into cryogenic suspension until they are awakened.

BERSERKER DALEKS

Berserkers are the lowest rank of Dalek. Their intelligence is very low, bordering on the purely instinctual. They were created during the Time War and used for crude tasks such as wiping out entire planetary populations. Beserkers do not possess a manipulator arm. They are often equipped with buzzsaw attachments and multiple-barrel firearms.



DALEK NECK ASSEMBLY




