

wo trains have crashed on the Dalek Foundation world of Sunlight 349. Lillian Belle, a journalist for Sunlight 349 Holo-News, interviews a security guard, Daniel Ash. A Dalek arrives to investigate. Some medics with Mr Sezman, one of the drivers, speak to the Dalek privately and explain what happened. The Dalek kills them in secret and leaves.

The Doctor receives a hypercube inside the TARDIS. It contains a vague message summoning him to the desert planet Gethria. He finds a gathering of people at a stone monument. The Doctor realises that it is a funeral. The Doctor looks at the gravestone and finds a toy spaceship in it. The toy has 'Made in Carthedia' written on it. The Doctor is being watched by the Dalek Time Controller from his timeship. "It is beginning..." it says.

Back in the TARDIS, the Doctor receives a distress call from Terrin and Alyst Blakely - their spaceship is being attacked. The Dalek Time Controller fires an energy pulse at the TARDIS, knocking it off course. Consequently, the Doctor arrives on Terrin and Alyst's ship too late. He finds a recording of Terrin and Alvst about to throw themselves out of the airlock. They are trying to stop the Daleks from capturing them and gaining knowledge of a formula. The Doctor finds Terrin and Alyst's three children hidden in an escape pod: Sabel, Jenibeth and Ollus. He returns the ship to their home planet Carthedia. The Doctor learns that Ollus has a toy spaceship. A family friend named Hogoosta gave Terrin and Alyst the formula. The Daleks are seen as a positive force on Carthedia.

The Doctor is questioned about Terrin and Alyst's disappearance. The flight log containing their recording that implicated the Daleks is now blank. He tries to explain this to a crowd of disbelieving journalists. "The Daleks are evil!" he cries. "I don't know how long you've been thinking the Daleks were your friends, but I'm here to tell you that you can be sure that they are up to something. I'm not sure what it is, but it has something to do with Gethria. Some secret so terrible that the parents of these children were prepared to make the ultimate sacrifice to keep it from them."



The Doctor is arrested for incitement to hatred after denouncing the Daleks. The children are taken to an orphanage while the Doctor is put on trial. The Dalek Litigator is the prosecutor. The Doctor tries to provoke the Dalek into revealing its true personality but it remains calm. The Blakelys' assets are seized by the Dalek Foundation. The Doctor's lawyer, Hellic Dansard, asks for him to be allowed to see Sabel, Jenibeth and Ollus before his sentence is carried out. Much to the Doctor's surprise, the Dalek Litigator agrees.

Hellic and the police take the Doctor to the children who are being kept in a rundown orphanage. The Doctor uses his sonic screwdriver to shatter a wall and they escape, taking off in a skimmer which Ollus is able to fly. Hellic and the police follow. The Doctor sees the TARDIS on a landing pad with a Dalek guarding it. The Doctor uses the hologram projector in Ollus' toy spaceship to create images which the Dalek mistakes for an attack. It fires at the sky, scattering the police skimmers. Hellic's skimmer crashes into the Dalek and kills them both. Ollus lands the skimmer and they make it to the TARDIS. The children learn that it is a time machine and ask the Doctor if he can use it to save their parents. The Doctor wonders if he could find a way to do this without breaking the laws of time. However, another energy pulse hits the TARDIS, sending it off course again.

Hogoosta is working at an archaeological site on Gethria. He is worried about Terrin and Alyst. Klektid enforcers arrive and throw everyone off the site. The TARDIS

appears. Hogoosta tells the Doctor about the Cradle of the Gods, a monument they have discovered. Inscriptions on it suggest that its purpose is creation or destruction. The Klektid enforcers chase them away. The Doctor materialises the TARDIS closer to the Cradle and they investigate. The Daleks arrive. The

Doctor, Sabel and Ollus escape in the TARDIS. Hogoosta is killed and Jenibeth is captured.

Lillian Belle has grown suspicious of the Daleks since the train crash. She is approached by a member of a secret resistance trying to overthrow the Dalek Foundation. Lillian is given a report on the murders at the train crash site and information about the Doctor. She makes contact with him.

The Dalek Supreme demands that the Dalek Time Controller activate the Cradle of the Gods immediately. The Time Controller refuses. "The Doctor's course is set. Set by me," it says.

The Doctor, Sabel and Ollus are taken to a resistance meeting but a squad of Daleks invade and apparently kill the rebels. The Doctor and the children escape. The Doctor interrupts Lillian in the middle of a news report and transmits a live message to everyone on Sunlight 349, urging them to rise up against the Daleks. The people still refuse to believe that the Daleks are evil. The Dalek Litigator arrives and puts the Doctor on trial again in public. The crowd supports the Daleks. The

Doctor is unable to provide any proof of his accusations. Sabel and Ollus defend the Doctor but the Litigator makes them question their trust in him, noting that they only have the Doctor's word as to how their parents died. The rebel members emerge unharmed – the Litigator states that they are care workers. It declares that Jenibeth will be found and the Blakely children will be left

in Lillian's care. More Daleks arrive with the TARDIS and the Doctor is forced to leave. He says goodbye to the children and hands Ollus the hypercube, telling him that if he ever needs him, he just has to think of him.

Ninety years later, a carer named Gill is taking care of a frail and elderly Ollus. She tells him that his sister, Sabel, is expected to recover from her cold in hospital. Gill sees the hypercube and asks about it. Ollus begins to remember the Doctor as he drifts into sleep.

The Doctor lands on Gethria again shortly after he left the funeral. He now realises that the funeral was for Ollus, An old woman he saw earlier returns. The Doctor mistakes her for Sabel but it is really Jenibeth. The Doctor takes Ollus' toy spaceship off the gravestone. Terrin and Alyst placed the formula to activate the Cradle of the Gods inside the toy. The Doctor is about to smash the tov when Jenibeth reveals that she is a Dalek agent. A Dalek ship arrives with a captive Sabel and Ollus. The Daleks faked Ollus' funeral. The Dalek Litigator reveals that they sent the Doctor the hypercube to trick him into leading them to the Cradle and activate it. They intend for the 400 Sunlight Worlds to be transformed by the Cradle into "a billion Skaros". The Litigator then transforms into the Dalek Time Controller. It demands that the Doctor use the toy to activate the Cradle

the Sunlight Worlds into sweets. Jenibeth has been a Dalek prisoner for decades and has had no education. The Cradle is guided by her mental power but she still has a child's mind. The Doctor sets the Cradle to self-destruct. The Time Controller tries to kill him but Jenibeth attacks it. Jenibeth destroys the other Daleks. The Time Controller shoots Jenibeth and retreats.


Sabel and Ollus comfort the dying Jenibeth, telling her stories of their childhood. The Doctor tries to get them to safety inside the TARDIS before the Cradle explodes but he has no choice but to leave them. He takes cover in the TARDIS. When the danger passes, he finds them all as children again, thanks to Jenibeth's influence. The Cradle has also converted all of the Sunlight Worlds, reverting them to the way they were when they were children.

A new spacecraft arrives. Terrin and Alyst Blakely have also been recreated by the Cradle. The Doctor leaves in the TARDIS before they are reunited with their children. He is momentarily happy about the Daleks' defeat, but then remembers how easily he was manipulated by them. The Doctor decides: "No more meddling. No more."

Sabel tells her family that she thought she saw a man. Her parents tell her she must have imagined him. As they leave, Sabel hears a faint wheezing and groaning sound in the distance.






