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


First Broadcast:

28 November 1964

Ian and the Doctor are surrounded. “When I give the word, turn and dive in the water,” Ian whispers to the Doctor. But something is rising out of the water, coming towards them. The two men whirl around to make their escape but are stopped in their tracks by a horribly familiar sight: a Dalek is approaching them. It is in command of the strange men. “The human beings are to be taken to Landing Area One,” it orders.

Ian is stunned to see a Dalek on Earth. The Doctor steps forward, demanding that they be released. The Dalek is unimpressed by the Doctor’s talk of resistance. “I have heard many similar words from leaders of your different races,” it says. “All of them were destroyed.” The Doctor calls the Dalek a “poor, pathetic creature”. The Doctor and Ian are grabbed by the men and taken away. The Dalek is left alone. “We are the masters of Earth!” it proclaims to itself, over and over.





on the Daleks. Tyler thinks it would be a fatal mistake. Dortmund proudly shows him his new bomb. It hasn't been tested, but Dortmund is convinced that it will destroy their enemies. David Campbell returns with some food. He tells Tyler and Dortmund that the Doctor and Ian have been taken to the heliport near Chelsea.

The Doctor and Ian are brought to the entrance of a Dalek saucer. Ian is confused. "We saw the Daleks destroyed on Skaro: we were there!" The Doctor points out that their adventure on Skaro probably took place a million years in the future. "What we're seeing now is about the middle history of the Daleks," he explains. They note the discs on the Daleks' backs that allow them to travel on non-metallic surfaces. Two more prisoners are herded into the group. The younger man tries to run before they are all moved inside the saucer but is killed by the Daleks. The older man, Jack Craddock, is saved by Ian, who restrains him.

Barbara and Susan examine two helmets identical to the ones worn by the strange humans they saw earlier. David and Jenny explain that the men they encountered are Robomen, people that the Daleks capture and transform into servants. "There aren't that many Daleks on Earth," Jenny reveals. "They needed helpers. So they operated on some of their prisoners and turned them into robots." David explains that the Daleks' control over the Robomen eventually fades. "I've seen the Robos when they break down. They go insane. They smash their heads against walls. They throw themselves off buildings or into the river." Barbara is disgusted.



"Daleks. Everything they touch turns into a horrible sort of nightmare," she says. Jenny says that they converted her brother last year. "Once they've got you onboard a saucer, there isn't a hope," she says. Susan fears for Ian and her grandfather.

Ian, the Doctor, and Craddock move through the interior of the saucer. They are forced into a cell. The Doctor is observed on a monitor by the Dalek Saucer Commander. "Give them the test," it says. Craddock thinks escape is impossible, but the Doctor remains optimistic. Ian asks Craddock how the Daleks invaded Earth. He explains that a meteorite storm began 10 years ago, badly damaging Earth. When that ended, a new plague spread across the world, killing millions.



In a dingy underground room, a group of resistance fighters dressed in rough clothing listen to a Dalek broadcast on a radio. It urges the public to surrender and obey the Daleks. "Obey motorised dustbins?" Dortmund replies contemptuously. The people laugh as their morale rises for a moment. A young woman named Jenny checks Susan's injured ankle. She tells Barbara and Susan that they'll have to work if they want to stay with them.

SCRIPT CHANGES



There were many changes made to Terry Nation's script before recording began. In the opening scene, the Doctor defiantly said to the Dalek, "I've been to many planets in several solar systems. Always as an impartial observer. I shall pit myself against you and defeat you." Ian joined in, saying, "When all the history of Earth is put together, the Daleks won't occupy more than half a page." It wasn't originally Barbara's idea to use the Robomen helmets as a disguise; three men were already preparing to do that when she and Susan arrived at the rebel headquarters. David explained to them that the Daleks' invasion began in 1980 when Earth was hit by a meteorite storm that spread a disease. Most of humanity was wiped out in four years. The Daleks encircled the planet with their warships and conquered the world in a week. The episode concluded with the rebels on board the saucer rescuing the Doctor and Ian, but with Tyler unsure if Dortmund's bombs would get them back out past the Daleks.

SAUCER SET

The Dalek saucer at the Chelsea heliport was a major challenge for director Richard Martin and the production team. "This was stretching Riverside [Studios] to its ultimate," Martin commented in 2003. "This saucer took up the whole of the centre of the studio and left us with very little space to do any filming and to put up any other sets. It was very ambitious. And then I asked for a few broken helicopters to be strewn around the perimeter and was told no way [laughs]!" As one of the show's earliest directors, Martin helped shape the ambition that became a long-standing tradition of *Doctor Who*: "We were not going to be limited to that under-budget, on-time concept of production."





“Germ bomb?” the Doctor asks. “Yeah. The Daleks were up in the sky, just waiting for Earth to get weaker,” Craddock replies. “Whole continents of people were wiped out. Asia, Africa, South America...”

Meanwhile, Susan and Barbara are also being told of Earth’s recent past by David. “The plague had split the world into tiny little communities,” he says. “Too far apart to combine and fight, and too small individually to stand any chance against invasion.” David explains that many cities were simply burned to the ground. The Daleks have established vast mining areas where humans are forced to work.

“What is it that the Daleks want on Earth?” Ian asks. Craddock pauses, unsure. “Something under the ground,”



he says. “They’ve turned the whole of Bedfordshire into a gigantic mine area.”

The Dalek Saucer Commander makes another broadcast to the humans still hiding in London, urging them to come out and surrender: “Rebel against us and the Daleks will destroy London completely,” it says.

In the resistance headquarters, Dortmun shows everyone his weapon. “This bomb will shatter the casing of the Daleks,” he says. “We don’t need to run or hide any more; we’ll make them run!” The resistance group is excited by the news. Dortmun struggles to rise to his feet: “One victory will set this country – the whole of Europe – alight!” Barbara suggests that using the Robomen helmets as a disguise would allow them to gain entrance to the Dalek saucer.

In the Dalek cell, Ian examines a transparent box with a metal bar inside. The Doctor uses a magnifying glass to pull the bar out of the box and then uses the bar to open the cell door. The Daleks have used the escape to test the Doctor’s intelligence. He is grabbed by two Robomen and dragged away. “He will be robotised!” a Dalek declares. Ian and Craddock are pushed back into the cell. The Doctor is taken to a small table and made to lie down. There is machinery above him. “Anesthetise him,” a Dalek coldly commands.

David, Susan, and Barbara arrive at the heliport. Tyler and the others arrive, disguised as Robomen and their captives. They are about to enter the saucer



when a Dalek stops them. “Wait. In which sector were these prisoners taken?” it asks. The Dalek is suspicious when the supposed Roboman gives an incorrect answer. David and the others start hurling bombs, but they have no effect. Some people are killed by the Daleks.

Tyler and the other rebels run inside the saucer and look for prisoners. They don’t notice the unconscious Doctor on the operating table. “Commence the operation,” a Dalek tells a Roboman. The robotising machinery above the Doctor is suddenly activated...



Bernard Kay played resistance leader Carl Tyler: “In those days we had a week’s rehearsal for every half-hour programme. So by the time we’d rehearsed with the Daleks for a week, they were like people we’d invited into our homes, y’know, people we knew. And we had to act the

surprise and the alarm and the fear, because we knew that little Bloggins was peddling away in there to save his life and couldn’t go down a flight of steps. It was, in a way, an elaborate joke. But it was a joke that hit the public nerve. [Doctor Who] started as a programme for kids: scary but not terrifying.” Kay soon returned to Doctor Who in *The Crusade* as Saladin. He also appeared in *The Faceless Ones* and *Colony in Space*.

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DAVROS

Davros had been existing in a state of heightened awareness for over 90 years, trapped inside a cryogenic suspension chamber. He was unable to move even the slightest of muscles, frozen like an immortal statue but permanently awake.

The so-called 'Supreme Dalek' had been reduced to hiring human mercenaries to carry out its plans.

Davros felt a sense of satisfaction. The Daleks had always abused his

generosity in the past; he had given them life on Skaro, and they had turned on him almost immediately. They had returned for him only when they needed his help against the Movellans. Now they needed him once more, but this time he would ensure that they understood who was in control. His children would learn that he was their one true master.

Davros used a neural reprogrammer hidden in his chair to take mental control of one of Lytton's men, Kiston. He demanded the use of a laboratory on board the prison ship instead of one offered to him on the Daleks' own battlecruiser. Davros stated that he wished to remain close to his cryogenic chamber in case of an accident, but the truth was that he would have sooner died than return to that state of dismal half-life again. Davros knew that the second he moved into the Supreme Dalek's battlecruiser, he would be at the mercy of his rival. And 'mercy' was not a word he had ever given the Daleks.

Davros' task was to find a cure for the Movellan virus. He had been assigned two Daleks for his 'protection', but they were obviously his guards. Davros bridled at the defiance his own creations were displaying. They belonged to him; they were nothing more than living examples of his genius. They were soon ordered to expose their mutated forms for tissue removal. The neural reprogrammer turned them into Davros' obedient subjects – they were the first truly loyal Daleks he had ever known.

Davros had another goal: to capture, humiliate, and kill the Doctor. Thinking of the Doctor had been one of the ways he had remained focused during his 90 years of suspension. He had often pictured his mocking smile and had devised a thousand different ways to twist it into a portrait of abject terror. Davros considered the fact that, even after two encounters, he still knew little of the Doctor's origins. He ordered his

two Daleks to upload all their data on the Doctor, and he began to read it via a holo-screen. It was fascinating. He had heard the phrase 'Time Lord' before, but he had no understanding of its significance. The Doctor came from an ancient race of time travellers from the planet Gallifrey. He had been a thorn in the Daleks' side for centuries, constantly undermining their conquests and aiding their enemies. A variety of faces flashed across the holo-screen. It seemed that the Doctor had the incredible ability to change his appearance, a useful skill for a temporal spy.

At last Davros saw the purpose of the Doctor's arrival on Skaro at such a crucial point in the Daleks' origins. He had been sent by the Time Lords to wipe the Daleks out before they had even been born. The Doctor was only one agent in a gigantic temporal conspiracy. The Movellans meant nothing – Gallifrey was by far the Daleks' deadliest enemy. The Doctor's timeship, the TARDIS, was also revealed to Davros. It was an extraordinary vehicle: dimensionally transcendental, capable of disguising itself, and able to appear at any point in the space/time continuum. What a weapon it would be in his hands.

The Doctor was brought to him under guard. Gone was the curly-haired clown, replaced by a younger, more solemn individual. But the Doctor had lost none of his ingenuity; the guards were actually



on his side, and Davros found himself suddenly facing a laser rifle wielded by his old enemy. Davros spoke quickly: the Daleks' files on the Doctor had made him aware that he held a spurious regard for morality and compassion. He told the Doctor that he planned to recreate the Daleks, lessening their ruthless nature. The Doctor hesitated, as Davros knew he would. He was soon distracted by Lytton's approaching troops, giving Davros the chance to shut the naive fool out of his laboratory.

Davros passed capsules of the Movellan virus to his servants and ordered them to kill the Supreme Dalek's forces. Two Daleks blasted their way into the laboratory and prepared to exterminate him, but the virus swiftly took hold, and they died screaming as white fluid exploded out of their casings. Davros watched in triumph. No matter how powerful the Daleks had been, no matter how deadly they might become, they would always be his children – and he would always be their superior. "The Daleks are dead," he said. "Long live the new Daleks!"

But as Davros moved towards an escape hatch, his chair suddenly malfunctioned. Every nerve in his body seemed to be burning. The same white fluid began to leak from his chair as he glided around the room, out of control. "No! I am not a Dalek!" he cried. "I cannot die! I AM DAVROS!!!"

Silence filled the chamber. The aged figure in the chair had stopped moving. Davros seemed completely lifeless.

But to believe that would be a mistake many had made in the past...





COMPONENTS OF ISSUE 70

70A BASE FRAME COVER (labelled D)

70B BASE FRAME COVER HOLDER (x 2)

BP ELEVEN 2.6 X 5MM PB SCREWS (1 spare)




#70-01
Take the base frame cover assembly from the previous issue. Check how the connecting plates **67B** and **69B** fit over the raised screw sockets at each end of the base frame cover **70A** (labelled D). Fix each of the connecting plates in place with three **BP** screws.

2**#70-02**

Fit one of the base frame cover holders **70B** over the join between part **67A** (labelled **E**) and **70A**. There is a recess in the top of the flanges on parts **67A** and **70A**, and the edge of part **70B** fits in to this. Fix in place with two **BP** screws.

#70-03

Fit the second base frame cover holder **70B** over the join between part **69A** (labelled **C**) and **70A**. There is a recess in the top of the flanges on parts **69A** and **70A**, and the edge of part **70B** fits in to this. Fix in place with two **BP** screws.


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
